

COOR ISD Guidance Regarding Permitted Actions

Under Revised School Code 380.1307a-h

Permitted Action*	Conditions	Documentation & Reporting
Physical Escort from One Area to Another	Using minimum contact** needed to move student from one area to another, which would not include pushing, pulling or carrying someone.	None
Brief Holding	To calm or comfort; Prevent impulsive behavior that threatens immediate student's safety, such as running in front of a car.	None
Break Up Fight or Stop Physical Assault	Stopping or preventing students from hurting others is not a restraint if an emergency situation continues to exist. Once a physical assault is broken up, an ongoing action that prevents or significantly restricts a pupil's movement will be considered a restraint.	Refer to school district incident reporting procedure.
Physical Assistance	For student completion of task or response if student doesn't resist or resistance is minimal (i.e. handover-hand assistance).	None
	Necessary to comply with emergency drills or procedures (tornado drill, lock down, etc).	None
Adaptive/Protective Devices (e.g. helmet, splint, activity chair, etc.) Individualized Safety Equipment (e.g. wheelchair securement, safety harness)	When used as directed by physician or therapist (e.g. OT, PT, SSW) or determined by the IEP team which includes parent and therapist. When used as intended by manufacturer or as directed by physician or therapist.	504 Accommodation Plan or IEP PLAAFP and Supplementary Aids & Supports, Personal Care or Anticipated Needs/Other Comments, or Transportation or Special Factor and Notice. • Equipment Justification Form
Medication	When administered according to	Refer to school district procedure

Emergency Seclusion	Intended for the purpose of emergency situations only, in which a pupil's behavior poses imminent	Attempt to report to parent as soon as feasibly possible and document attempts.

Provide a copy to the parents within one (1) school day.
	May not be used with preschool students.	Debrief with parent and staff. Document on state-approved <u>Debriefing form</u> . Complete within one (1) to three (3) school days.
Emergency Physical Restraint	Intended for the purpose of emergency situations only, in which a pupil's behavior poses imminent	Attempt to report to parent as soon as feasibly possible and document attempts.
Please refer to <u>District</u> <u>Board Policy</u> and <u>MDE</u> <u>Policy for the Use of</u> <u>Emergency Seclusion &</u>	risk to the safety of the individual pupil or to the safety of others. The emergency situation requires an immediate intervention.	Document incident on state-approved Emergency Seclusion documentation form or district form. Provide a copy to the parents within one (1) school day.
Restraint	Adhere to Cornell TCI caveat to Physical Intervention Practice.	Debrief with parent and staff. Document on state-approved <u>Debriefing form</u> . Complete within one (1) to three (3) school days.

^{*}Limitations on Use-

The actions described above are not permitted:

- In place of less restrictive interventions, education programming, adequate staffing or positive behavior intervention supports.
- As discipline or punishment.
- For staff convenience.
- When inadvisable based on student's disability, health care needs, or medical/psychiatric condition.
